**DESCRIPTION:** The Inclusive Education Module will provide a "look back" at the history of inclusive education in Nova Scotia to provide background to the importance of the Inclusive Education Policy as the anchor that guides our practice in schools today, and a "look forward" to examine research-based best practices for our classrooms and schools.

- explore: Teacher as Leader, Shared Vision, Communication, Equity and Inclusion
