### Background

In a contractual agreement between the Nova Scotia Teachers Union and the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development, an annual sum of \$200,000 is allocated for the purpose of encouraging innovative and unique program development in Nova Scotia's schools. Programs funded or assisted under PDAF must be directly related to the Public School Program.

PDAF is intended to encourage breakthrough and alternative ideas at the local school level which significantly and directly enhance the delivery programs and services to students. This may include, but is not limited to, taking an established curriculum practice or program and using this in a new and unique way. PDAF provides teachers with financial support to initiate creative and innovative teaching practices. As a result of this support, students benefit from enhanced learning experiences.

### Program Selection

Each program proposal is carefully reviewed by a selection committee made up of educators appointed by the Nova Scotia Teachers Union and the Nova Scotia Department of Education and Early Childhood Development Programs and proposed materials are reviewed by consultants within the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development. Each application is thoroughly examined for transformative elements which will enhance the development of unique educational experiences for students in the public schools of Nova Scotia.

### Applicant Criterion

Applicants must be **active NSTU members** and have received a notice of assignment during the **current school year**.

Teachers are eligible to receive **one PDAF grant per school year** (Aug 1<sup>st</sup>-July 31<sup>st</sup>).

To reapply, previous program must be complete (summary evaluation submitted to NSTU Office)

### Application Deadlines

Applications must be received by the **first day of August, October, December, February, April, and June, or the first business day closest to the first of the month**. The PDAF Committee meets to review applications within **the deadline** month. After this meeting, applicants will be informed in writing of the committee's decision.

- Cover page** (see final page of this application) with **all signatures** from the program coordinator, Principal (or designate) and Regional Executive Director of Education (or designate) and acknowledgement of having consulted with RCE/Board Technology personnel as applicable.
- A program proposal in either a word document or a pdf** that includes:
  - Program Description and Rationale**
    - Briefly describe the program. (CSAP applications in French are accepted)
    - What specific need(s) within your school/classroom does this program address?
    - List the goals of this program.
  - Program Team:** Briefly describe the interests, background and qualifications of the program team which will enable them to successfully implement this program.
  - Program Design**
    - Briefly describe why this proposal is innovative and merits PDAF funding.
    - Explain this program in terms of how it will be implemented in the school and/or classroom.
    - What is the timeline you intend to follow?

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Program Selection Criteria

The PDAF Selection Committee will base their selection on a variety of criteria including:

- o Breakthrough/Innovative ideas for your learning space
o Addressing the school's, students', community's needs
o Sustainability/Partnerships
o Uniqueness of program tied to curriculum outcomes
o Inclusive and Culturally Responsive Practice
Links: African Nova Scotian Education Framework
Mi'kmaw Ways of Being and Knowing
o Evaluation Process
o Direct benefit to school/student
o Parental and/or community involvement

Additional Considerations

- o Each proposal is considered exclusively on the basis of its own merits
o The PDAF cannot be the only/first source of funding if the budget exceeds \$5000. Other sources of funding MUST be included.
o PDAF does not fund consecutive programs
o The program proposal must not require an ongoing financial commitment by PDAF
o The Selection Committee does not consider itself bound by precedent from one proposal to the next

PDAF funding is not available for the following:

- 1) Salaries, honoraria or labour fees\*
2) Travel and accommodations/meals (teachers and students)
3) Equipment rental, service and/or labour costs
4) Items contained on the Authorized Learning Resources (ALR) list (AKA Book Bureau)
5) Teacher professional learning - or sub days
6) Subscriptions as they do not meet the requirement for sustainability noted in selections criteria

PDAF funding is not normally available for capital equipment. The PDAF Committee does approve capital items when they are required to successfully implement the proposed program. PDAF Committee does not fund programs that are now considered best practice and are no longer considered innovative. Innovative is not limited to technology.

Program Coordinator Responsibilities

- submit an Accounting Summary complete with ALL original receipts totaling the Full Amount of the grant. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that purchases are made in the appropriate currency.
submit a 100-word description of the program (and photos if requested from committee with permission as per RCE guidelines) for publication purposes
contact the PDAF Committee Chair (amarchand@staff.nstu.ca) should changing circumstances result in the program not being implemented
sign and return the letter of undertaking
Complete and return the Evaluation Report
