Mandate:

The mandate of the Political Action Committee is:

i. Political Action

- A. The Committee shall maintain contact with all major provincial political parties including, if possible, as members of those parties.
- B. The Committee shall monitor the policies and practices of the major provincial political parties for the purpose of identifying issues impacting on education and NSTU Members. The Committee shall then advise the NSTU President and Provincial Executive of these issues.
- C. During provincial elections, the Committee shall monitor the major provincial political parties for their public education platforms and policies and inform the NSTU President and Provincial Executive of any concerns.
- D. The Committee shall identify educational issues for consideration by the Provincial Executive for political action.
- E. The Committee shall identify corporate social responsibility and social justice issues for consideration by the Provincial Executive for political action.
- F. The Committee shall develop strategies for encouraging NSTU member involvement in the political process.
- G. The Committee shall develop strategies for encouraging NSTU member involvement in the election process including exercising their democratic right to vote.
- H. The Committee shall seek opportunities to build relationships with educational stakeholders.
