Why do you wish to participate in ICE (formerly PO) this year?

Using a concrete example, please explain how your most recent project experience has changed or influenced your understanding of power, privilege, and/or solidarity.

It changes your perspective on privilege when you experience being the minority. In NS I come from the position of privilege, being an educator with higher education, a wife, mother, teacher and white. I feel like I have a better understanding since I have experienced being the minority in a group, where I am not the colour of the majority of the population around me and do not necessarily speak the dialect used.

How might your past PO experience change your approach to ICE this time?

Mes expériences m'ont fait réaliser que même que tu te sens prête pour l'expérience et que tu as assez préparé, il y a des choses qui arrivent que tu ne peux pas prédire. Ton attitude et ta façon de penser vont te permettre de passer une bonne expérience... ou non. C'est aussi les membres de ton équipe que vont te supporter dans ces situations.

Recalling your past PO experience, what did you gain personally and professionally?

Personally, I became aware that I am capable of dealing with unforeseen circumstances that are out of my control in a way that is respectful and am able to make the best of a situation, even with team members who are having difficulty. Professionally, I learned that it is possible to work together to accommodate the needs of all involved, and sometimes it is difficult to make others understand that not all needs can be met at all times.

What is most important for you to share about Canada? What would you most hope to learn about your host country?

A significant personal challenge for me would be working with team members who are not respectful of others and who have unrealistic demands or expectations of the host team. I would work to model the attitude I believe in, to respect them and to educate to the best of my ability, the realities of our location.

In my last placement there were significant challenges in the location which made it difficult to accommodate the needs of all team members. The team worked with our co-facilitators to accommodate the needs of our team, I believe that I worked well with our Ugandan team to make the best of our circumstances.

Team members were unhappy with the food that was made available to them and made a request that other food be made available. Our counterparts took items from their own home and shopped for grocery items that were unavailable in the local community in order to accommodate the request. Although I understand that nutritional requirements be met, I also feel that participants understand that they may be placed in a situation where the foods available are different than those they would typically have.

Why do you wish to be a team leader for the International Cooperation for Education (ICE) project (formerly Project Overseas)?

I would be happy to be a team member but would be willing to be a team lead because I feel I could be a good representative for the needs of the team and the project.

The top 2 responsibilities of a team leader are to be a voice for the team and to facilitate a working relationship between the host country and the team.

Why do you think you are well suited to be a team leader?

I believe that I would be well suited to be a team leader because I feel I can be professional in interactions with others while balancing professional and personal relationships.

What might you do as a team leader to promote positive personal and professional experiences for your team members?

For a team to be successful there must be a balance of respect and understanding for the circumstances that may arrive. It is important for the team to meet and build a relationship before the project and for the team members to feel like they have a say in the division of tasks. And for the team to understand the realities of the host environment.

How will you foster respectful intercultural exchange?

Fostering intercultural exchange happens when we are respectful of the cultural norms of the host country. By being aware of the living conditions and realities of the professionals involved we are able to share our realities without making our hosts feel that we are more privileged than them.

As a team leader, what challenge might you face that you would not experience as a team member? How would you handle it?

As a team lead, we are often asked to represent the team with the higher levels of the host union. This means meetings, media, etc and also would involve mediating the two sides when or if situations become difficult. It is sometimes hard to be respectful of the teams need and the realities of the environment.

How will you foster effective relationships between your team members, union colleagues and others with whom you will work?

It is possible to foster effective relationships between team members, union colleagues and others by being respectful and responsive of their needs and opinions. Open, honest discussions and give and take will show an appreciation for the work of others.

Team dynamics can "make or break" a project experience. How will you cultivate positive team dynamics?

Positive team dynamics works by getting to know each other, being aware of individual needs and concerns before, during and after the project. Having frequent check-ins and being honest about our own needs as well.

As Team Leader, how might you monitor and guide your team members as they live and work in a country historically affected by (neo-)colonialism?

As team lead, I would want to be aware of the history of the country and would want to have discussions with the team members on how they feel, what they know and how they would respond to certain situations. We would have to discuss how to act professionally even though we may not be in favour of things we see or hear.
