RE: Absences Due to 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19)

The NSTU has been receiving inquiries about the potential impact of COVID-19 if members are unable to work as a result of COVID-19. The NSTU has added a page to our website to provide current updated information to our members about coronavirus (www.nstu.ca/coronavirus).

There are a number of possibilities that would cause a member to be unable to work as a result of COVID-19:

- The member is ill;
- The member is not ill and is advised to self-isolate by a medical professional or public health; or
- The member is not ill and is guarantined by a medical officer or other person prescribed by law.

The member is ill

If the member is ill, then personal sick leave pursuant to the appropriate Regional or APSEA Agreement can be used.

The member is not ill and is advised to self-isolate by a medical professional or public health

If the member is not ill but has been advised to self-isolate due to travel to an at-risk area or close contact with someone who has a confirmed case of COVID-19, then the member should be provided with paid leave pursuant to Article 31.03(i) of the *Teachers' Provincial Agreement*. This paid leave continues until the member is either no longer advised to self-isolate **OR** becomes ill. If the member becomes ill, the member's leave would change to paid sick leave pursuant to the Sick Leave Article in the member's Regional or APSEA Agreement.

The member is not ill and is quarantined by a medical officer or other person prescribed by law

If the member is not ill and is quarantined by a medical officer of other person prescribed by law, then the member should be provided with paid leave pursuant to Article 31.03(i) of the *Teachers' Provincial Agreement*. This paid leave continues until the member is either no longer quarantined **OR** becomes ill. If the member becomes ill, the member's leave would change to paid sick leave pursuant to the Sick Leave Article in the member's Regional or APSEA Agreement.

It is important to note that a member cannot make the decision themselves to self-isolate or be quarantined. However, in the current situation related to COVID-19, the Government of Canada has issued guidance on their website (http://canada.ca/coronavirus) regarding who should self-isolate based on travel. Any member who self-isolates, pursuant to Federal Government advice, should receive paid leave pursuant to Article 31.03(i) of the Teachers' Provincial Agreement as outlined above. Please note that the Federal Government has also advised persons self-isolating pursuant to the advice, to also contact public health in the province they live in within 24 hours of arriving in Canada for advice. Members who self-isolate, pursuant to the Federal Government's advice, may be asked to provide evidence of travel to an at-risk area within the time period outlined in the advisory.

The Province of Nova Scotia has issued additional guidance on their website (http://novascotia.ca/coronavirus) indicating that persons who have come into contact with someone who has a **confirmed** case of COVID-19 should also self-isolate. Any member who self-isolates, pursuant to Provincial Government advice, should receive paid leave pursuant to Article 31.03(i) of the *Teachers' Provincial Agreement* as outlined above.

It is important to remember that paid leave under Article 31.03(i) of the *Teachers' Provincial Agreement* is only available if the leave is not provided under sick leave or any other provisions of the *Teachers' Provincial Agreement* or the Regional or APSEA Agreement applicable to the member. This means that paid leave under Article 31.03(I) is only generally available while the member is self-isolated or quarantined AND not sick.

Members with questions related to absences from work that are related to COVID-19 should contact the NSTU for specific advice related to their individual situation.
