## SUBJECT: March on House of Assembly

Yesterday, the Nova Scotia Government introduced Bill 148 - Public Services Sustainability (2015) Act.

In response to this, the NSTU is organizing a mobilization of the membership to march on the House of Assembly tomorrow, Wednesday, December 16<sup>th</sup> beginning at 5PM.

Members are encouraged to participate in the march on the legislature beginning at 5PM.

There will be two buses at the following three NSCC locations to transport members to and from the march. The first bus will leave at 4PM and the second bus will leave at 5PM to accommodate various dismissal times.
