## Morse elected vice-president of the Canadian Teachers' Federation

Outgoing Nova Scotia Teachers Union president Shelley Morse was elected vice-president of the Canadian Teachers' Federation (CTF) today, during CTF's 2016 Annual General Meeting held in Montreal, Québec July 13 - 15.

Morse will continue to serve at the provincial level as the NSTU Past President for 2016-2017. She will return to her position as teaching Vice-Principal at Aldershot Elementary School in the Annapolis Valley.
