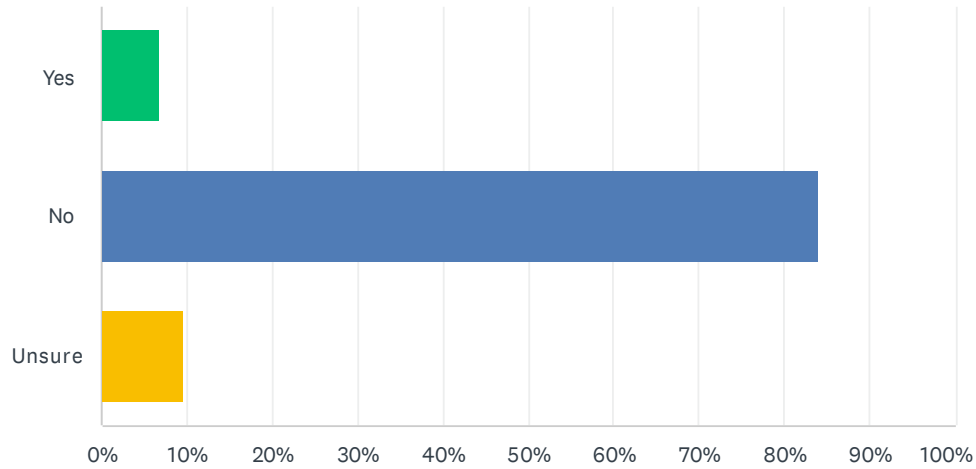


Q1 Do you believe the current back to school plan adequately protects the safety of you, your students and your family?

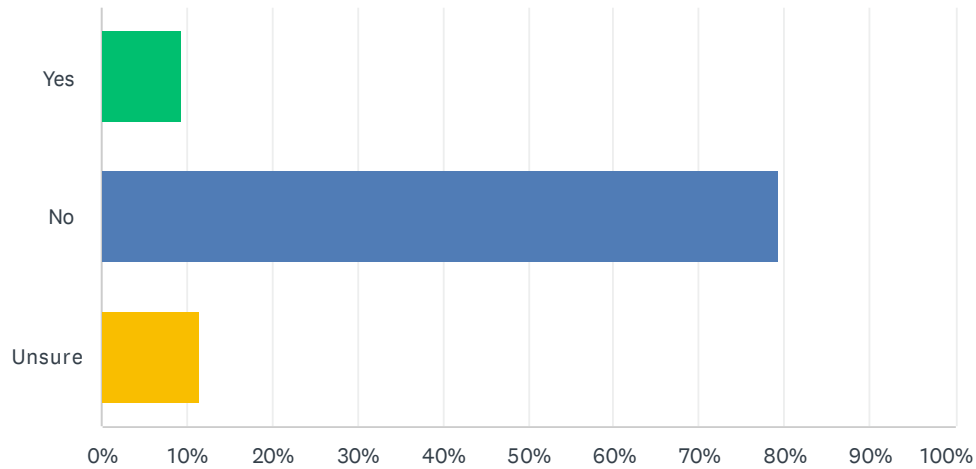

Q2 Given the current high levels of COVID-19 transmission across Nova Scotia, do you believe that schools can remain operational if they resume in-person on January 10, 2022?

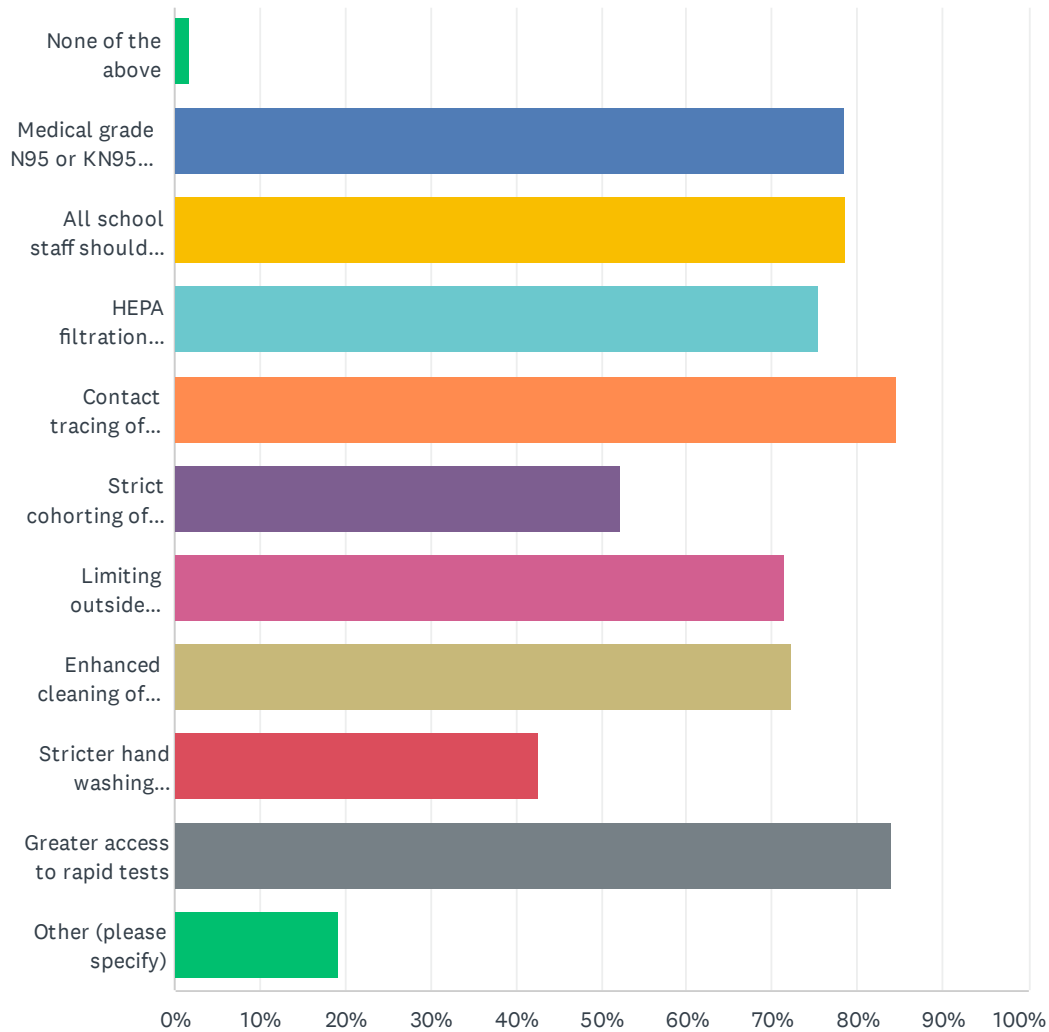

Q3 Which of the following do you believe are required to ensure schools can remain safe and operational in January (you can check more than one box).

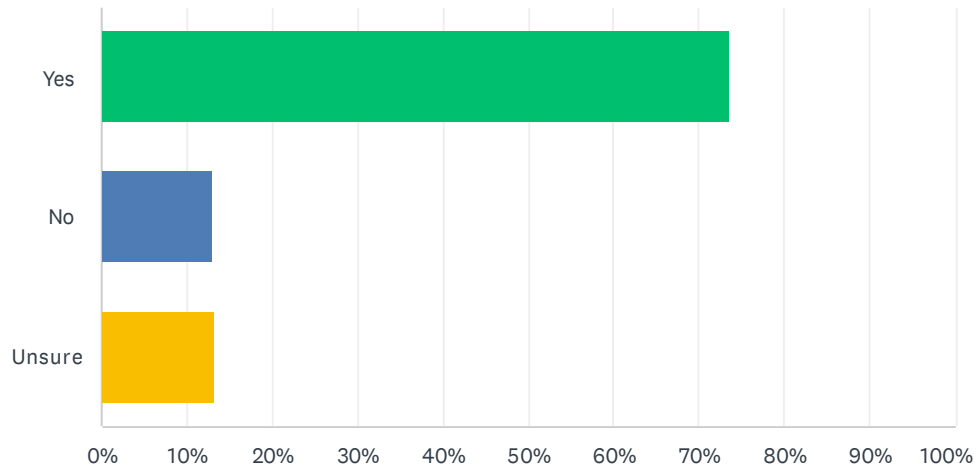
