Wozney acclaimed vice-president of Canadian Teachers' Federation

(Halifax, NS) Nova Scotia Teachers Union president Paul Wozney was acclaimed as a vice-president of the Canadian Teachers' Federation (CTF/FCE) at its 2021 Annual General Meeting held virtually July 14 to 15.

"I am honoured to serve in this capacity and look forward to continuing my work with other teacher leaders across Canada in advocating for students, teachers and public education," says Wozney. "Ensuring safe and vibrant learning and working environments within the continued challenges created by COVID-19 will be a top priority."

He is one of four vice-presidents acclaimed for two-year terms. As a vice-president, Wozney will serve on the CTF/FCE Executive and deal with key issues that impact public education, students and teachers nationally. This is the second time he has served in this capacity. He was a vice-president in 2019-20.

"It's imperative that the voice of teachers be taken into account in ensuring quality, inclusive, publicly-funded public education," he adds. "The CTF/FCE's focus in advocating for adequate resourcing, labour rights, and social justice, across Canada and around the world is something I value greatly."

Paul Wozney was re-elected as 45th president of the Nova Scotia Teachers Union on October 28, 2020. Prior to beginning his term as NSTU president, he taught at Charles P. Allen High School in Bedford and represented the Halifax County Local on the NSTU provincial executive.

Founded in 1920, the Canadian Teachers' Federation is the national voice for the teaching profession. As the national alliance of provincial and territorial teacher organizations, the CTF/FCE represents over 300,000 elementary and secondary school teachers across Canada.
