The Professional Development Committee met on the following dates during the 2016-2017 school year:

The activities of this year's Professional Development Committee included the following:

- Reviewed the Professional Development Annual Report 2015-2016
- Reviewed the Online Committee for Vetting Grants/Awards Online noting that Members likes
 the new online accessibility. The PD Committee moved to request staff investigate having our
 PDF application for Out of Province grants placed online.
- The Committee worked on revising the criteria and vetting process for Out of Province Grants.
- Committee members were assigned RRC Zone Contacts to seek concerns, questions and applause.
- The Committee vetted 36 Out-of-Province Conference grant applications recommending twelve recipients of \$475 each with four alternates to the Provincial Executive. In the April meeting, the Committee vetted 10 Out-of-Province Conference grant applications, recommending the PE award seven members \$425 each.
- reviewed the NSTU Curriculum Policy and forward their submissions on or before November 15, 2016.
- In review of the 2016 PD Conference Evaluations, the committee noted comments showcase a need for us to focus on Article 60.
- The Committee received and recommended to the Provincial Executive award the three applicants for the Education Research \$475 each.
- The Committee received three applications for the Full Time Study grants and made the recommended to the Provincial Executive awarding three applicants \$2000 each.
- The Committee received ten applications for the Travel Fellowship grants and recommended 10 members to the Provincial Executive to received \$300 each.
- Charting Your Course article, promotion in The Teacher in October, Promote with VP of PD in
 October sending out a flyer to go with Rep mailing to mention at local meetings. Committee will
 look at promotions for the following: PDAF, Full Year Study Leave and Research Awards.

• Discussions took place regarding themes of Provincial Workshops. Our key topic is transitioning to New Normal, re: putting yourself first, how to say no, what is professional, non professional (extra curricular), and volunteer responsibilities.
